During the morning your Preschooler will be involved in many fun learning activities. We start our mornings with a Circle time that includes our theme for the day along with Bible stories, songs, fingerplays and books. We have a morning snack and then we meet again for circle to review what we've learned that day.

Our Sunday Morning program includes Worship at 9:30 and 11:00 in-person or online at <a href="https://www.okolonacc.org">www.okolonacc.org</a> Our nursery, preschool, and elementary ministries have a 9:30 and 11 o'clock services. Preschool has "WEE Celebrate" which is specially designed for Preschool children and "KIDS Celebrate" for Elementary Children. Middle School meets during the 9:30 service, and high school meets during the 11:00 service in the "Commons". During the week there are many other opportunities for studies and service. # PARENT HANDBOOK

## "Program"

Okolona Christian Preschool believes that Early Childhood should be a time of fun, love, security, exploring and discovery. Preschool children are creative and very excited about learning. Our staff strives to nurture and encourage these qualities in our children.

Okolona Christian Preschool's purpose is to provide an atmosphere that encourages spiritual, social, emotional, physical, and intellectual growth and development of the child as a whole. We believe that children learn best by doing, and that the Activity Center approach does this more effectively than any other teaching model. Children will be busy working at centers such as art, blocks, home living, instructional manipulatives, etc. Each day they will have a Circle Time that will include the daily Bible story and teaching themes. A Sample Daily Schedule is included in this handbook. Your child will have a wonderful, busy time and will come home wanting to tell you all about what they've learned today!

Okolona Christian Preschool is an extension of the Outreach Ministry of Okolona Christian Church. Since we are in session for less than 10 hours per week, we are not required to become state licensed; however, we follow all of the safety and health codes as are applicable.

### "Admissions"

Okolona Christian Preschool admits children age 3 to 4 years old. JCPS requires Kindergarteners to be 5 years old on/before <u>August 1</u>. Admission requirements (based on KY Educational admission rules) and enrollment procedures are as follows:

- A. A 4 year old must be Four years old on or before August 1 to be admitted into our Four year old program.
- B. A 3 year old must be Three years old on or before August 1 to be admitted into our Three year old program.
- C. Classroom assignments are based on a child's birthdate.
- D. Your child must be potty trained before school starts.
- E. Each class will have up to 15 students with 1 teacher and 1 teacher's aide.
- F. Classes are filled on a first-come basis according to the date of enrollment.

  Please go to https://www.okolonacc.org/weekday-preschool-2/r to enroll. You must have your \$125 nonrefundable registration fee, automatic tuition payments scheduled, medical form, and walking permission forms, submitted in order for your child to be considered 'enrolled'.
- G. If the classes are already full, when a parent calls, the child's name may be placed on a waiting list.

# "Important Forms"

### Your child will be enrolled only after all the following forms have been turned in online:

- Online Non-Refundable Registration fee \$125 this covers snack, special guest, special events, and all craft supplies.
- On-line Registration documents filled out and special permissions signed
- Set-up Online Automatic Reoccurring Tuition Payments of \$200 for monthly payments unless paying lump sum amounts.
- A current immunization certificate <u>valid through the end of that school year.</u> (available from your child's doctor). A shot record is not acceptable. The immunization records may be emailed to <u>okolona.preschool@okolonacc.org.</u>

All of these forms (excluding the immunization form) are online. Your immunization certificate can be acquired from your doctor. It is essential that we have a current certificate for each child enrolled in our program. Also, please pay special attention to the enrollment form and the people who can pick up your child. We must be very strict on this, as your child's safety is very important to us!

### "Curriculum"

We will be using the Beginner Bible which is a great Bible designed for Preschoolers. Each lesson features a Bible character and a life value that was evident in his or her life. Children will discover values such as JOY taught in the story of the shepherds visiting the manger, HELPFULNESS taught in the story of Jesus calling His disciples, and THANKFULNESS taught in the story of Jesus healing the ten lepers. Each lesson correlates with a theme and reinforces basic skills such as transportation, communication, seasons, and self-esteem.

Along with this curriculum we will also be teaching letters, numbers, shapes and colors every month. The daily schedule will consist of a circle time that teaches the Bible story and its coordinating preschool theme and then at the end of the school day a review circle time that reinforces the day's lesson. We will be introducing a letter per week to the children, familiarizing them with their shape and sound. We will also have a color, number and shape of the month (i.e. the letters A, B, C, the color Red, the number Zero and the shape Circle are taught in September). We will also teach the true meaning of holidays. Halloween themes (i.e. witches, monsters and ghosts), Santa Clause, and the Easter Bunny will not be a part of our Curriculum. Instead, we will learn about God's abundant goodness in Fall, the Gift of His Son at Christmas and the excitement of New Life at Easter.

Each week we will have a Chapel Time which will introduce your child to Large Group Praise and Worship. We'll say the pledges, recite our weekly Bible verse, have prayer, sing songs and have a Bible Story aimed all Preschoolers. They'll Love it!!!

# "Discipline"

When and if your child has difficulty following directions in class, they will be gently reminded that their parents want them to learn to obey and that they should obey their teacher. If the child's disruptive behavior continues, and they have received several warnings, they will be removed from the group activity. After a few minutes in "The Thinking Chair" they will be asked to join the group, if they can make the right choices now. Children will not be allowed to hurt their teachers or classmates with words or actions. We want them to make choices that show others that they are friends and that they care about them just like Jesus cares for all of us. The teacher and the student will come up with a plan that will help them to make the right choices. If the problem persists, the

parents will be notified and a conference may be scheduled at the earliest possible convenient time. Please encourage your child to make good choices and to always do the right thing!

### "Tuition"

# **Please READ Thoroughly**

Yearly Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year is \$1800 which may be paid using one of 3 options:

- 1) One-time payment of \$1,800 which may be paid online by September 1, 2024.
- 2) Two payments of \$900 to be paid by September 1, 2024 and January 1, 2025.
- 3) 9 monthly payments of \$200 to begin on September 1, 2024 and end May 1, 2025.

<u>In addition there is a non-refundable Registration and Supply fee of \$125</u>, which covers the initial paperwork, snacks, special guest, special events, and basic supplies for your child throughout the year. The non-refundable Registration and Supply fee will be paid at the time of registration.

Your child will not be given a spot in a classroom until automatic tuition payments are set up. Tuition is due, even if your child is unable to be present. Tuition will continue to be owed until your child is officially withdrawn. **Tuition will be due the first of each month.** 

All parents will need to set up an automatic reoccurring tuition payment online. If you are unable to pay online, please contact the Preschool Director to make other arrangements.

If your child's tuition is one (1) month passed due, you will receive a phone a call reminder to pay the months tuition fee promptly. If you child's tuition is (2) months passed due your child's account will be placed on probation. If your child's tuition is three (3) months passed due, your account must be paid in full for your child to keep their spot at OCP. If tuition is unpaid after the 3 months, you child may be dismissed from preschool.

If you are having financial issues, please contact the Preschool Director to discuss your situation. We will make every effort to be flexible because we love your child and want to see him/her grow. We want to give as much grace and provide as much support as possible.

OCP tuition is a non-deductible tax item. However, End of the Year statements will be sent out in December. If you do not receive one, please contact the director at Okolona.preschool@okolonacc.org.

### "Schedule"

We will be open Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays except during Thanksgiving, Winter and Spring Breaks. Our hours are from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. Please be on time (9:30 and 12:30). Cars line up at Door #3 and children are ushered to their classes by the teachers. For 9:30 Drop off: please place your child in the back seat of the passenger's side. While waiting your turn in line, please have your child unbuckled, put on their backpack and be ready to exit the car quickly!

When picking up your child, you will need to be in the car line 5 minutes before pick-up. It is better for you to wait than for your child to wait. It is mandatory that you have your **child's Car Sign**; this lets us know you've been approved to pick up. When receiving your child in the car line, please pull forward to buckle you child in so that the carline can continue. Remember, it's important that you be punctual! Tardy arrivals and late pick-ups disrupt schedules. Please share this information with whoever will be transporting your child! Thank you!

## "Emergency Schedule"

Please watch the morning local TV news stations and their websites to find out about snow closings. We may not always have the same decision as Jefferson County Public Schools as they make their decision based on so many more schools and students!! Here's how you can find out our schedule:

- 1. Call the preschool's voicemail number and hear our plan for the day (502-962-6521).
- 2. Check the church's website: <a href="www.okolonacc.org">www.okolonacc.org</a>. If possible, the Closing information will be on the Preschool Home page of the church's website. Also, watch the local TV news channels. Many news stations allow you to sign up for text alerts when your child's school schedule has changed.
- 3. Your teacher should message you the status of preschool and our plan for the day through Remind 101 app.

Please under any circumstances, do not attempt to get to school if your roads are hazardous or dangerous. The main roads may be passable but certain subdivisions are treacherous. Please use your own best judgment and let safety be your guide. Be assured that we do not like to close – we love working with your children and have so much to do! If we're off, feel free to have preschool with your child. Have them play flashcards with you or write their letters and numbers for you. Maybe you can even go over the calendar and record the weather. They may even like a turn being the teacher! It's amazing what they'll teach you!

### "Custody"

It is very important that you write a note or call the preschool voicemail (502-962-6521), or your teacher if someone besides the parent (or regular driver) will be picking up your child. Please pay special attention to the enrollment form and the people you list who can pick up your child. If they have a car sign, we will assume you have been in contact with them and they have permission to pick up. So please Guard your Car Sign! We will be very strict on this, as your child's safety is extremely important to us. We will not release your child to anyone who is not on this list. We reserve the right to check identification when unfamiliar adults are picking up your child. The school has no legal authority to refuse either parent the right to pick up their child or to refuse to disclose to either parent information concerning the child, their behavior, progress or financial account, unless a court has granted temporary or permanent custody to one parent or to a third party *and* the school has been furnished with a copy of the order bearing the court's signature. If you have been granted temporary or permanent custody of your child, please provide the school with a signed copy of the order. The school cannot be placed in the position of arbitrating a child's release to a parent or the visitation rights of a parent or other family members. If you know of a specific person who may try to pick up your child and is not allowed to, it is your responsibility to tell the Director and your child's teacher.

# "Clothing"

Please send your child to school in play clothes. Remember it is best if the clothes are easy for them to take on and off in order to use the restroom, i.e. zippers or snaps are great! If they wear a belt, make sure they know how to use it. We ask that they wear tennis shoes and not any kind of sandals. Clothes need to be comfortable, easy and weather appropriate. Clothes need to be comfortable, easy and weather appropriate.

Please prepare a spare change of clothing for your child: a top, bottoms, socks and a change of underwear. Label each item with child's name and place it in a clear gallon size zip-loc bag and leave it in the bottom of their backpack. Please make sure to send seasonally appropriate clothing for you child. Please do not send an umbrella at any time. We ask that all umbrellas stay 2024-2025/Registration/OCP-Parent Handbook 24-25

at home as they are unsafe in a group of children. Please make sure all backpacks are regular size. (Please do not send the small character backpacks; they are really cute but are not quite big enough for our school projects).

# "Child of the Day"

During the year, each child will have a turn at being "Child of the Day"! This is a very special day for your child, as they will have leadership responsibilities in the classroom. For example, they may be the line leader or special helper. Due to increasing awareness of allergies and snack limitations, OCP will be providing snack this year. This just eliminates the guesswork on what is allowed and lightens the parents responsibility to provide snack. However, your child will still get to be a special helper when they are child of the day

### "Snack"

We realize that food allergies can cause serious life threatening conditions for some children. To keep all of our children safe, we will strive to limit those foods that have been determined to cause allergic reactions OCP has decided to provide snack for the upcoming school year. At the beginning of the school year we will compile a snack list that OCP will purchase snacks from. These are the only snacks that will be available due to allergy concerns.

### "Bring a Lunch to School"

TENTATIVELY: During the month of May, the 4-year olds will be bringing their lunch every day in order to prepare them for Kindergarten. Please make sure that you purchase lunch boxes that are easy for your child to open and will fit easily into their backpacks. Please include a cool ice pack with their lunch, if needed. Your child will be encouraged to eat as much lunch as they can (never forced to eat it all!). We will teach them to eat their "growing food" first (i.e. sandwich, pasta, yogurt or whatever you send as a main entrée). They will not be allowed to share their lunch with other classmates. Please keep in mind, other children's allergies when sending in lunch food. Please don't send in peanut butter, especially if there is an allergy in your class. When finished, each child will clean up their space, throw away their trash and put away their lunchbox in its appropriate place. (If you don't want their trash thrown away so you can see what they've eaten, please tape a note inside their lunchbox or tell the teacher!) Please remember to include spoons, napkins, straws or whatever else they will need in order to eat their lunch. It is best if their lunch consist of one growing food, one snack and one drink. Most Kindergartens only have about 20 minutes to each so we will encourage them to eat quickly.

# "Toys and Personal Items"

Backpacks will be taken home daily. This will aide in communication and Child of the Day. On show and share days, please send in a "show and share" item that fits in your child's backpack. Blankets, Lovies, and pacifiers will not be allowed at preschool. Please keep those special things at home.

### "Health"

<u>Children must have an immunization certificate valid until the end of the school year from their doctor upon enrollment</u>. A copy of shot records is not sufficient. Also, we must have a new Medical Release form each school year.

Please call the office if your child is sick or is going to be away for an extended time. Do not bring your child to school if he/she is exhibiting the following symptoms:

- Temperature over 100 degrees,
- Yellow/green nasal discharge,
- Cough that is "barky" or "wheezy",
- Diarrhea or vomiting,
- Earache,
- Conjunctivitis (pink eye).
- Lice

If you suspect your child is coming down with something or if your child has a runny nose that has any yellow or green color, we would appreciate you keeping him/her home as a precaution from exposing children or staff members to any infection. Students must be symptom free for 24 hours before returning to school. Please be considerate of other children at school our staff. Let's try to keep everyone as healthy as can be.

Should a child become ill during the morning, the parent will be notified immediately. We will take your child to a quiet resting-place and try to keep them as comfortable as possible until the arrival of the parent or other authorized person. In the case of an injury during school, a staff member will administer first aid. First aid will consist of cleansing the wound(s) with soap or applying ice unless otherwise advised by the parent. Next, the wound will be appropriately bandaged. In the case of an accidental injury requiring more than simple first aid, the parent or authorized adult will be notified immediately. If we are unable to contact you immediately, we will contact your physician. If medical attention is required, the staff will call emergency 911, who will transport the child as well as an adult, to the nearest local hospital unless otherwise specified in the child's emergency information. Incident Report Forms are filled out for all accidents and a record is kept. We cannot administer any medications, prescription or over-the-counter drugs, during school hours.
